Letter from Micah

So much happened at The Foundry in 2021-2022. So much happened in our world during this same time. Addiction is everywhere. In our families, at our workplaces, in our churches and for some even in our families. The opioid crisis in our country is overwhelming. According to the CDC, more than 107,000 people died of a drug overdose, with 75% of those deaths involving an opioid last year alone. The Foundry exists to change this... one person at a time. The men and women we serve walk in our doors feeling ashamed, heartbroken, scared and usually alone. Addiction has taken everything from them and their hope for freedom has slipped away. The Foundry exists to change this.

The idea of continuously improving is central to who we are and a core value at The Foundry. Our philosophy is that God deserves our best and so do those in our care. This principle not only applies to us as a ministry but also to the individual participant as they just want to get better. Our team spent much of this past year rebuilding and revising the "how" of our Christ-centered approach to recovery. We are partnering with industry leaders and with innovative technology to bring the very best we can to the mothers and fathers, sisters and brothers and the sons and the daughters who walk on to one of our campuses. Our mission has not changed. Our purpose is as clear today as it was when we started more than fifty years ago. We exist to restore hope to the addict through Jesus Christ. It does not end there but a foundational relationship is the only place to begin a journey of true freedom. So many are trapped and feel hopeless, and The Foundry exists to change this.

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Amber's Story

My name is Amber Collins. I was in addiction for over 20 years. My first memories of pain and fear started at three years old when I was molested in Sunday School. My mother was also verbally and physically abused. The enemy came after me in church because I am a threat to him.

I was given alcohol at the age of nine and marijuana at thirteen. As a teen, I continued to be sexually assaulted, emotionally, and physically abused. The older I got, the more I hated myself and used substances to feel normal. The self-loathing grew more and more.

Other kids used to say that when we are drunk, that is who we really are. This stuck with me and created a stronghold. Intoxicated, I was a horrible person who did horrible things, and I carried this mentality for many years. This was a sick cycle.

I lost my family and went through a separation from my children. I had nothing and cried out to God for His help.

I heard that drums symbolize war and tambourines freedom/victory. I started asking God to provide a drum and tambourine while I was in addiction. Well, he did!

One day, while using drugs, someone brought me a bongo drum and a 1960s tambourine. I started to declare war and victory. A few days later, someone put a preacher on tv, and my spirit was fed.

I continued to praise my way to the Foundry Women's Center. Death had been coming for me. The Foundry helped me dig up roots and replace them with seeds of faith, healing, life, forgiveness, and discipleship. His word says to walk in His power and authority because he came to set the captives free. Just because I was not behind bars in jail didn't mean I wasn't in my own prison.

For the Lord to trust me and use me in ministry is jaw-dropping. If it wasn't for The Foundry planting seeds, feeding my spirit, and giving me a chance at life, I wouldn't be here today. I have never had this kind of love, and I fight daily to protect it.
















What difference can you make? You would be surprised. Being an influential force in someone's life is simple as being there, ears active and heart open. The men and women needing your influence are on our campuses right now.

life change programs

When the pandemic hit, we knew there was a great opportunity to rethink our process. So, we got to work and asked ourselves two difficult questions. How can we increase the quality of our program? How do we make it even more accessible?

So we had to rethink EVERYTHING from workforce development to counseling, so that as many people as possible could come to our programs and transform their lives.

To continue to address this critical need in our communities, we totally revamped our Life-Change Programs. These five individual programs, three core residential programs, and two transitional housing programs are the new core of The Foundry Mission.

Our 9-month residential program will become a 6-month residential program, significantly increasing our yearly capacity, allowing those unable to commit for a full year to attend. Also, we are launching Grow and Give weeks. Participants will go to their serve assignment one week and classes the next. Think working a part-time job in college.

We have partnered with **Unbound Grace** to match our pre-graduates with community mentors and with *Unstatus Your Quo* to connect participant's with career coaches, Beginning this year. **Hope Inspired Ministries** will be administering their award winning curriculum here on campus.

The changes were implemented at our Bessemer recovery programs in September, and will continue at The Farm in early 2023.

We are beyond excited. Without your unwavering support, none of this would be possible.
