THE FOUNDRY OUTREACHES & MINISTRY CENTERS

Community Outreach Center

Individuals and families struggling with poverty or the aftermath of tragedies are assisted with food, clothing and other vital resources, along with referrals to practical resources and activities that foster friendship and fellowship.

Changed Lives Christian Center

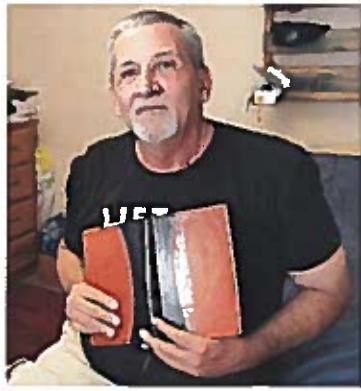
Located in downtown Birmingham, this outreach provides meals and basic medical care for homeless men, along with transitional housing for graduates of our men's Recovery and ReEntry programs.

Worship Center

The message of God's love is shared with our residents, their families and the community through spirit-filled music and worship, each Thursday evening and Sunday morning.

Men's Recovery Center

Through the Christ-centered curriculum of our long-term Recovery Program, men working to overcome addiction experience practical guidance, adult education and employment readiness training that empowers them to rebuild stable lives.



Foundry Farm

Our Foundry Farm campus, located amid 60 acres of rolling hills and dense forests east of Cullman, offers a peaceful setting for men in our Recovery Program who benefit from a rural environment.

Women's Recovery Center

In this comfortable and home-like setting, women in our residential Recovery Program are offered spiritual guidance, life-skills training and other tools they need to break the chains of addictions and to return to their roles in their families and communities.

ReEntry Center

Counseling, education and life-skills classes are offered through this residential program, preparing ex-inmates for a successful transition back into society.



The Foundry Auto Center

Reliable pre-owned cars, trucks and vans are available for customers seeking vehicles at reasonable prices, and proceeds from the sales support our programs and services.

The Foundry Dental Center

A team of dental professionals and dental students provide low-cost exams and standard procedures to our program participants and our neighbors in the Bessemer community.

The Foundry Thrift Stores

New and gently used clothing, furniture and household items are sold at affordable prices through our three store locations in Fairfield, Cullman and Pelham, and the revenue supports our comprehensive outreach.

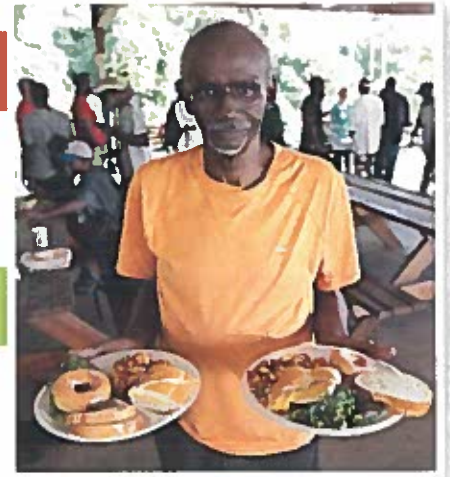
